Pastoral (Year Reps)	A year representative is a member of the GSC who represent their year group cohort. To feedback recommendations on how school life can be improved for the benefit of all. They are responsible for collecting the feedback and results from the 'PV Feedback Friday' sessions and delivering results to the library. To represent their year in a positive manner.
